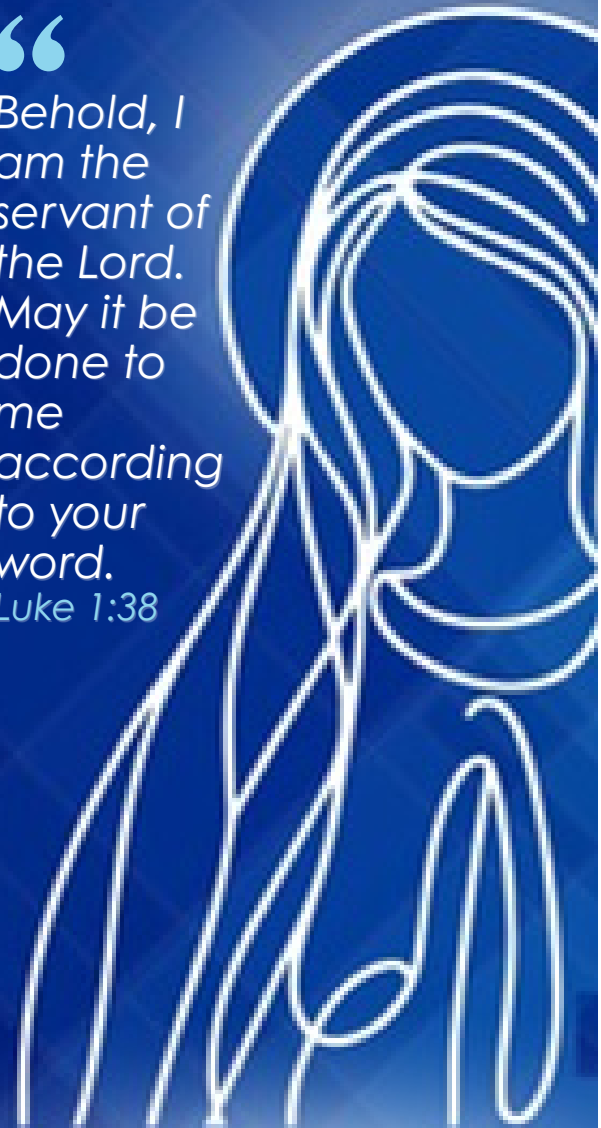

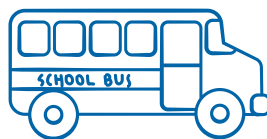

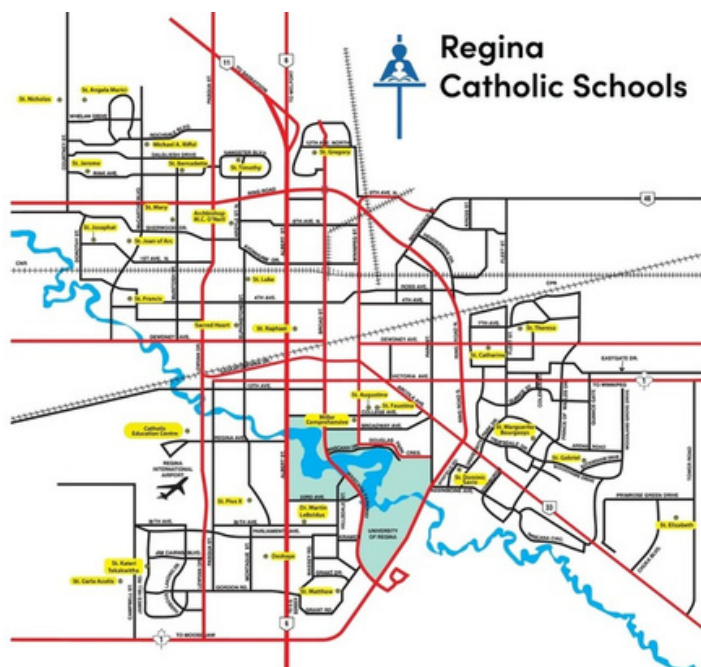

Students and staff build understanding through meaningful partnerships with Elders, Knowledge Keepers, families, and Indigenous communities.



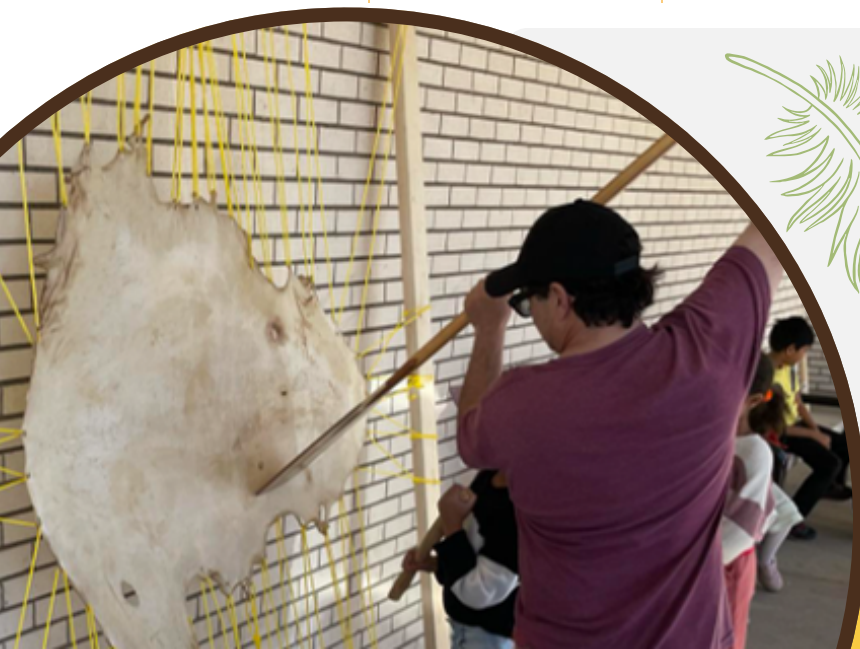

- Utilize universal screening strategies, in English and French, three times per year to detect areas of concern in reading acquisition, with early detection and intervention in Grades 4-8.
- Implement a research-based, evidence-based phonics program for core instruction and for intervention with struggling readers at any grade.
- Provide professional development and resources targeting literacy, writing, and numeracy instruction that is responsive to student needs.
- Provide intervention supports in reading, writing, and math, guided by ongoing data review at the school and division level.

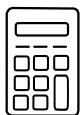

- Provide targeted supports for Indigenous students and families, including relationship-building, attendance initiatives, and graduation pathways, to enhance student success.
- Recruit, develop, and retain a diverse workforce that reflects the identities and experiences of the student population.

- Use the *Portrait of a Graduate* as a vision of the desired student outcome, guiding our actions, priorities, decisions, and planning.
- Advance future readiness by connecting student learning and graduation to pathways for success, including employment, entrepreneurship, self-employment, skilled trades, community engagement, and continued learning, while supporting students with diverse strengths, abilities, and aspirations through partnerships with employers, community organizations, industry, and educational institutions.
- Coordinate and enhance supports through Student Support Teams, Guidance Counsellors, and Indigenous Advisors to help students remain engaged, successful, and on track for graduation.
- Prioritize proactive family communication and engagement, particularly at key transition points, through supports such as orientations, school tours, Spend-a-Day activities, and parent information sessions.
- Strengthen attendance and engagement strategies through early identification and intervention, credit tracking, mentoring, and strong relationships with staff.

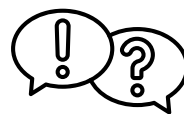

Enterprise Risk Management supports responsible stewardship by helping Regina Catholic Schools identify, assess, respond to, and monitor risks that could affect our students, staff, operations, resources, and ability to fulfill our mission.

OUR ENTERPRISE RISK LANDSCAPE

RISK 01

Duty to Accommodate - Students

Risk that increasingly diverse and complex student needs require additional specialized supports, staffing, resources, and adequate Provincial funding. If these needs cannot be effectively accommodated, student success and educational service delivery may be impacted.



RISK 02

Rising External Pressures on School and Educational Capacity

Risk that responsibilities traditionally addressed by health, social service, and community support systems continue to shift to schools, increasing demands on staff and resources and affecting the Division's capacity to deliver its core educational mission.



RISK 03

Spending within Means

Risk that rising costs, inflationary pressures, and funding constraints may reduce the Division's ability to sustain programs, services, and infrastructure investments while maintaining high-quality educational outcomes for students.



RISK 04

Labour Relations

Risk that challenges in maintaining positive and productive relationships with employee groups could lead to disruptions, increased costs, reduced organizational effectiveness, or impacts on the delivery of educational services to students.
